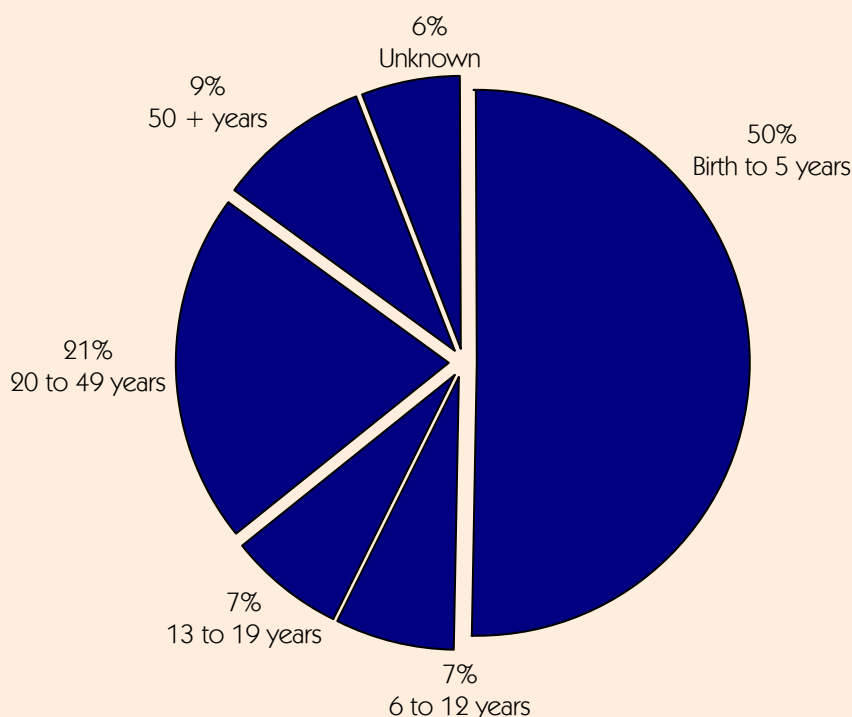


The Georgia Poison Center is staffed by highly skilled physicians, pharmacists, nurses, and other poison experts 24 hours a day, 365 days a year to offer confidential advice on poison diagnosis, treatment, and information. We are 1 of 56 poison centers certified and accredited as a Regional Poison Center by the American Association of Poison Control Centers. As one of the busiest poison centers in the country and the only one in Georgia, we receive calls daily ranging from physicians and emergency medical personnel to concerned parents. Since 1970 our call volume has increased from 3000 calls per year to over 110,000 calls received in 2007.
